**NEW PISD BUILDING ENTRANCE PROCEDURES 2/21/08**

**V-Soft**

PISD has a new system called V-Soft that helps to protect all students. V-soft helps track visitors, students, faculty, contractors and volunteers at our school, thus providing a new tool that assists us in protecting our student environment.

**Each time a visitor, volunteer or contractor check-in at the front office, or come to pick up students, EVERYONE will be asked to present a valid state-issued photo ID to the front office personnel for them to enter into the system.**

The system has the ability to provide alerts on people who may jeopardize the safety of the campus. Additionally, the system produces valuable information such as volunteer hours, print visitor name badges and monitor the number of guests who visit our campus. We ask for your cooperation in presenting your valid state-issued photo ID when checking in at the school.

If you need to acquire a State of Texas Identification Card, you can go to the Texas Department of Public Safety located at 2109 West Parker Road, Ste 224, Plano, TX 75023. Their phone number is 972-867-4221 and their hours of operation are Monday through Wednesday from 7:30am-5:00pm, Thursday from 8:00am-6:00pm and Friday from 8:00am-5:00pm.

**New Student Registration 8:00 --2:00**

**Mornings: Students should be in their seat by 7:45 when the bell rings.**

**Afternoons: They need to be picked up at 2:45 when classes are dismissed.**

**ABSENCES: PARENTS/GUARDIANS – CALL  AND WRITE A NOTE  ALWAYS!**

A parent/guardian must call the Child-Safe/Child Absence Line to report a student absent or late to school (arriving after 9am). Call 469-752-1100, choose option 1 for English, or option 2 for Spanish, next, press option 3 to leave a message. Leave the student name, date of absence, grade level, teacher name and reason for absence.

**PARENTS HAVE ONE (1) WEEK** after an absence to turn in a handwritten, signed note in order to receive an “Excused” absence. The note should include the student’s name, date/s of the absence and the reason for the absence. **A parent call does not excuse the absence – a note MUST be received.**

***DELIVERY GUIDELINES FOR FORGOTTEN ITEMS*** (example: forgotten lunches, school work, gym shoes, coats, etc....) Items must be placed in the “delivery” bookcase in the Front Office. Each item must be labeled with the Student’s Name, Grade Level and Teacher Name.

Deliveries are only made twice daily at 10am and again at 2pm.

Please make arrangements ahead of time for your child to get home safely. It is understandable that sometimes things happen during the day to change plans, however you must know that a message cannot be delivered to the student after 2:15.

***PISD Dress Code:***

**The PISD Dress code states that “Students Dress and Grooming are expected to be in keeping with accepted community standards.”**

**GUIDELINES FOR DRESS & GROOMING**

1. Shoes must be worn at all times.
2. Students in grades K-2 may wear regular shorts.  
Students in grades 3-12 may wear shorts but must meet the following standards:
  - a) Must be loose-fitting; no biking shorts, cutoffs, boxer shorts or combination thereof.
  - b) Must be hemmed or cuffed.
  - c) Length must be to the fingertips or longer.
3. Dresses or skirts must be longer than fingertips.
4. Tank tops, tube tops, halter type blouses or mesh shirts will not be permitted.  
Sundresses will be permitted if modestly cut. Shirts should overlap the waistband of skirts, shorts, or pants.
5. Items with provocative, offensive, violent, or drug related pictures or slogans will not be permitted. Items advertising alcoholic beverages or tobacco products will not be permitted.
6. No hats, caps, bandannas, hoods, wallet chains, or sunglasses.
7. No type of clothing which has been torn or has holes will be allowed.
8. No sagging pants or shorts.
9. No gang paraphernalia.
10. No visible pierced jewelry other than earrings.
11. All students are expected to meet community standards and school policies with regard to health, cleanliness and appearance. All safety rules must be obeyed.

In Integrated Curriculum (Science and Social Studies), we are studying about "balance and stability" and have met a mascot friend named Buddy Bear.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade:

### STRESS FREE, FLEXIBLE HOMEWORK

**Purpose:** Review and practice skills taught previously in the classroom.

**Time allotment:** To allow flexibility for family activities, your child will bring a homework packet home on Monday and it will be due on Friday. Each page should take approximately 15 minutes to complete. We also encourage your child to read 15 minutes each night, but they will not be required to complete a reading log. Additionally, they will need to study their spelling words for their tests on Fridays.

**Consequence:** If your child does not bring their homework packet Friday morning, they will sign the TOD chart for not being responsible and will have to complete a new packet during Free Time Friday. Parents, please help teach your children to be responsible by not driving their homework up to school when they forget it. It is their responsibility to bring their homework, not yours.

### MATH FACTS

Why is it so important for children to know their math facts in order to succeed academically? Quite simply, a lack of fluency in basic math fact recall significantly hinders a child's subsequent progress with problem-solving, algebra and higher-order math concepts. This can have a serious impact on a child's overall self confidence and general academic performance in math. The National Council for Teaching Mathematics new guidelines state that *second graders should be able to quickly recall basic addition and subtraction facts and fourth graders must have quick recall of multiplication and division facts.*

## Library

This year the Dooley Library will be promoting two reading programs. For grades 3 -5 we will again be reading for the Texas Bluebonnet Award. There is a list of 20 books the students have received. To participate in the January voting they must read or have read to them 5 or more of the books on this year's list. Those who choose to read 18 or more will receive an invitation to a very special celebration in the library in February. The forms have a place for parents to sign verifying that the books have been read. Our goal for the Bluebonnet program is to have every student be eligible to vote.

For grades K-2 we will again be putting scales on our Dragon in the hallway. Each student will have a packet in their take home folders. Please make sure these are kept in their folders so they don't get lost. There will be a list of book titles, authors and series on the yellow paper. As the students read or listen to a book you must check off the book and sign. For those books that are not specifically listed but have an author name or series name you may write the title of the book on the Get Fired Up for Reading form included. Every time

your child has checked off 5 books they get to come to the library and put a scale with his/her name on the dragon. Our goal for the Dooley Dragon Readers is to get every child to put on at least one scale.

Library League will be starting up for fourth and fifth graders. Students interested will be bringing home a form they must fill out and return to the library. Each library league member will choose a morning or afternoon time to come to the library. The times are 7:15 to 7:40 or 2:45 to 3:15. It can be any morning or afternoon except Tuesday after school. They will choose one time a week that will be their regular day. Students in library league get to learn how to run the circulation desk, put away books, process new books, etc. We look forward to another year with Library League.

**myPISD.net Parent Information**

Plano ISD is implementing myPISD.net, a new computer software desktop for students and staff at all schools. Students and staff will automatically be delivered school and class information that is relevant to them when they connect at school or at home. Students will view web pages specifically prepared for them by their teachers. These pages may contain calendars, important class files, assignments, informational bulletins, curriculum materials presented in class and a wide range of other electronic items. Students can communicate and collaborate with their peers and teachers via online forums and discussions, and can submit their work electronically when appropriate. Some of this information was formerly available on the Electronic Classroom Center (ECC) but will now be available in enhanced form on the students' myPISD.net class pages. As schools switch over to myPISD.net, the use of ecc.pisd.edu will end.

Students can also access this new software desktop from home by connecting to <http://schoolname.mypisd.net> ( <http://PSHS.mypisd.net> ) . The students use the same login and password that they use when logging into the network at school. The myclasses page contains a list of the student's classes as well as up-to-date grade information that a teacher has posted.
